Greetings exhibitors! The Board of the Northwest Peruvian Horse Club, and the Show Committee, welcome you. We are proud to host the 36th annual, Northwest Regional Championships, one of the longest running Peruvian Horse Shows in North America!

This show, is drug free. NAPHA has recently changed its drug policy. Previously there was a "zero tolerance" rule for positive test results, coupled with a 7 day recommendation for non-use prior to a show. With testing procedures becoming more finite, NAPHA recognizes the inappropriateness of that policy. Their Board of Directors made a motion to now defer to the USEF rules. While there may be a "positive" test, the potential exists for the displayed amount to be far less than therapeutic levels, and not to a degree that can mask injury nor enhance performance. Additionally, 4 vials will now be pulled for additional tests as needed. This adheres to the standard of NET (no effect threshold,) testing. The NPHC welcomes this change, since it avoids punishing exhibitors, and their animals, for administering needed therapeutic medications, weeks prior to the show. Many medications, such as phenylbutazone, are measurable in the bloodstream by modern techniques, such as HPLC, many weeks after administration, when the ability of the drug to affect performance has long since dissipated. APPROVAL & POINTS

This show is approved by the North American Peruvian Horse Association (NAPHA). This show will earn a minimum of double points for NAPHA Awards if the recorded owner(s) of the horse is/are a current NAPHA member at the time of the show—Year end Awards—Medallon de Plata, High Point Performance Horse/Gelding, Zone 1 and Lifetime Awards—Medallon de Oro, Medallon de Bronze and the new NAPHA Lifetime Award – Medallon de Diamante. This show is also approved by the PHAC for single points, except where a minimum of 25 PHAC Registered horses owned by at least 4 different PHAC registered owners attend the show, in which case one and one half points value will be applied.. Qualified entries will receive points toward annual and lifetime awards. All participants must present registration papers or proof of registration pending for every horse entered in this show, as well as proof of placings for direct entry into Ch of Ch classes.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Entry Fees

The unlimited fee is intended to act as an incentive to encourage people to enter more classes than they might otherwise do at a class by class rate. It applies to Juniors and adults. It also eases the burden on the office staff by rewarding those who pay one time in advance. If you have entered at the single class rate and wish to upgrade to the flat fee rate you may do so by paying the unlimited fee, however previously entered classes will not be credited toward that fee.

We do not require payment to be submitted with your entry form. It is hoped that this will encourage you to enter as many horses as you think might attend. Your payment at the show will reflect only the horses you bring. No vet excuse is required, however, a one time late fee of \$20/horse will be charged for horses not entered by the Deadline for mailing entries, 7/7.

Stall Fees ~ \$30/night, Tack Stall \$25/night

Stalls are available from Wednesday through Monday morning, including bedding. (Tack stalls have no bedding. If you arrive Wednesday and do not use the tack stall until Thursday, no charge for Wed. Likewise, if you clear your tack on Sunday afternoon, no charge for Sunday night.) Exhibitors should contact Kristin Eldridge - (360-770-6525 - Kristin@RancholaColina.com.) in advance with your stall requirements. Each horse entered must be assigned a separate stall, except mares with suckling foals, and must be placed in stalls as assigned. No showing out of trailers. Stalls containing horses may not be locked! Dogs must be kept on leash.

Post Entries

Entries should not be mailed after July 7th. Entries should then be texted, (541-350-2972,) emailed (NPHCShow2017@gmail.com.) or brought to the show, and will incur a one time \$20 late fee per horse. Fees need not be paid until arrival at the show. Exhibitors wishing to add classes must do so a minimum of three classes in advance. This may be done by notifying the Gate Steward.

RV & Camping

RV parking & camping are available at \$25/ day without hookup, \$30/day with power & water. Reserve spaces on the entry form, and notify Kristen Eldridge when reserving stalls. (360-770-6525 - Kristin@RancholaColina.com)

Display & Vendor Space / Evergreen & Business Sponsorship

There is a charge of \$100 for anyone selling anything on the Show Grounds Friday - Sunday. Contact DeAnn Long, (360-840-3500 longs.mail@wavecable.com.) for reservations. **Evergreen Sponsorship** - Ranches or vendors may place a banner in the arena for \$100 for the duration of the show and place ranch or vendor info on the hospitality table. **Business Sponsorship** - \$50 -info in arena.

Membership & Registration Requirements

Horses registered with the NAPHA, PPHRNA, AAOBPPH, or PHAC are eligible to enter this show. **Current registration papers for each horse must accompany entries. Proof of eligibility to enter directly into Ch of Ch classes must also be included.** The NPHC reserves the right to decline any entry. Anyone not in good standing with NAPHA may not enter this show. Exhibitors are not required to be members of the above organizations. Multiple registered horses should supply all papers.

Refunds ~ Please Note!

Entry fees are not due until arrival at the show. Charges will be based on horses actually brought to the show and no vet excuse is required. If a horse is present on the show grounds and deemed unable to perform, a veterinary statement must be presented to the Show Secretary prior to the end of the show in order to obtain a refund of class fees, only. No refund after one class has been entered. Purse class fees will not be refunded unless the horse is removed from the remainder of the show with a veterinary statement.

Class Changes & Substitutions

If a horse entered is unable to perform, another horse may be substituted. A horse may also be moved from one class to another. In each instance the gate **must be notified three classes in advance** but no fee will be charged. Changing riders or handlers is also free, but the same notice must be given.

Conduct

Each exhibitor will display their horse in the most natural way possible and maintain their horse in suitable manner. **No smoking is permitted in or around the barn areas. Dogs must be kept on leash.** Only participants in the class, the Judge, and Ring Steward and their assistants will be permitted to enter the arena. Attendants are not permitted in the arena unless summoned by the Judge or when specified in this Premium. Anyone entering the arena as an attendant must be dressed in white shirt and pants. Under no circumstances may the Judge be approached during classes. Any person or horse may be barred from entering the ring if not suitably presented. No one may make any remark or commit acts during the show that are considered offensive or made with intent to influence or cast aspersions on the judging. Any exhibitor may be barred from the show for this offense. Acts of discourtesy or disobedience to the officials on the part of an owner, rider, handler or member of the family participating in the show may disqualify them or their horses from adjudication. The management may remove any of the aforementioned persons from the show without being liable for compensation or damages. The NPHC reserves the right to decline any entry.

Ribbons

Rosette ribbons are awarded to fifth place in all classes except those for Juniors, which will be awarded to eighth place. First place finishers will receive engraved awards and Championship classes will be awarded neck ribbons and trophies.

Juniors

A Junior is between the ages of 6 and 17 as of January 1st of 2017. No Junior under 15 on January 1st of 2017 may show a stallion. No ungelded males over 12 months may be shown in any class designated solely for Juniors, nor may spurs be used. **Retrancas are prohibited for Juniors in any class; baticola is required, floron is optional. Helmets are mandatory for Juniors 12 and under, and encouraged for 13 and over. Leather covered Peruvian stirrups, (tapaderos,) are permitted in any class.** Classes are divided 6 to 12, & 13 and over. They may be combined, but judged separately. Juniors 15 & over may ride in Barridas, but signed consent must be given on the show entry form. **Juniors may not compete in Novicio Division Classes.**

Foals

No horses are to be allowed to run free, including foals, regardless of age.

Sales Presentation

There will be a presentation of horses for sale after classes 11, & 40. The enclosed form must be completed for all horses presented and a \$40 fee paid for each animal **not entered in classes at the show.** See form for further requirements.

RULES FOR CLASSES

Bozal Classes - 3, 7, 10, 36, 48 (see page 9 for percentages)

The same horse shall not be shown in both bit & bozal at the same show. Only horses 3 & 4 years old are permitted to show in bozal. First & Second place qualifies for Best Bozal (63). Bozal horses are allowed in classes 1, 2, 3, 6, 7, 8, 10, 12, 13, 18, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 28, 29, 31, 33, 36, 39, 42, 44, 48, 50, 52, 53, 54, 63 No jackets, ponchos, pellons or spurs.

Luxury Geldings Stakes (\$300 guaranteed purse) - 11

Horses in bit, only. Entry fee is \$50. Prize money to be divided as follows: 1st - 50%, 2nd - 30%, 3rd - 20% of purse. Judged as a breeding Class. No refund unless horse is withdrawn from remaining classes with vet excuse.

Reining - 12, 13, 49,

Open to horses 4+ in bit, amateur and professional. Jacket, or poncho folded on saddle (optional). Spurs are optional except for Juniors, who may not use them. Juniors may enter a bozal horse in junior class.

Ride a Buck ~ 54

Entrants will be riding bareback. They have a bill placed beneath their calf, reins in both hands. They cannot adjust the bill. They will perform maneuvers as directed by the announcer. The last rider with the bill still beneath their leg will collect all the other bills.

Synchronized Pairs Class ~ 50 (qualifies for Versatility Hi Pt)

Two horses perform together as in a Performance class. Judged on maneuvers, riding skill, ability to perform together, and how horses stay in sync. Bit or bozal.

Ladies/Gentlemen to Ride, Performance, 45, 47

Open to all genders, in bit. Judged as a performance class. Winners qualify for Performance Championship classes appropriate to their gender.

Trail Classes - 26, 27, 28, 29 (only 27 counts towards versatility)

Open to horses 4+ in bit, amateur and professional. No ponchos although jackets are allowed. Junior & Novice Horse may enter bozal horses. Three refusals allowed before the rider must proceed to the next obstacle. Trail classes held in the outdoor arena Saturday morning, 8:30 to noon. Vicki Paulus will be the Judge. New exhibitor bonus, see page 8.

Gait Classes - 30, 32, 34

Open to horses 4+ in bit, amateur and professional. 1st & 2nd place qualify for Best Gaited Horse of Show (64). 100% gait.

Bozal, 3, 7, 10, 36

1st & 2nd place qualifies for Best Bozal (63). 100% gait.

Amateur Performance - 35, 37, 38 (see page 9 for percentages)

The rider must be an amateur with a declaration on file. This class qualifies for the Champion & Reserve Amateur Performance Horse (56).

Drugs & Artificial Appliances

This is a drug free show, with testing. The use of performance enhancing drugs are banned. This includes, but is not limited to stimulants, depressants, tranquilizers, local anesthetics, and drugs which mask the presence of forbidden substances. The only exceptions are topical antibiotics and hormonal treatment for estrus cycle control. The NPHC enforces a zero tolerance policy with respect to forbidden substances, which have no place in equine maintenance. Therapeutic drugs will be limited to the NET, (no effect threshold) as prescribed by the USEF.

RULES FOR CLASSES

Crystal Class, Breeding/Luxury - 9

Open to all sexes, 12 years or over in bit (any horse born before 2006.) This class is intended to recognize the mature horse. It is judged as a Breeding class, but is non-qualifying. A crystal trophy will be awarded.

NPHC Amateur Owner Stakes (\$500 guaranteed purse) - 25

Entry fee is \$50. Rider must be an NPHC member, registered as the owner of the horse (or immediate family members), as well as an amateur with amateur declaration on file. Prize money to be divided as follows: 1st - 50%, 2nd - 30%, 3rd - 20% of entry fees. Judged as a breeding, bozal allowed, non qualifying. No refund unless horse is withdrawn from remaining classes with vet excuse.

Novice Horse ~ Trail 29 ~ New Exhibitor Bonus

This class is for horses which have not won more than four blue ribbons in any trail class. This class does not qualify for Versatility High Point. Any entrant who has not shown in a NAPHA or PHAC approved show in the past 3 years, may enter this class, along with one other non-pointed class, without incurring class fees. Other fees apply.

Get of Sire /Produce of Dam - 22 / 23

Get consists of 3 or more get, produce consists of 2 or more produce, bit or bozal, breeding, with emphasis on uniformity. Only one entry per sire or dam. To be made with permission of sire/dam owner.

Outstanding Junior Sportsman Award

Not a judged award, voted on by Juniors. The Sportsmanship award is presented to the junior showing the greatest sportsmanship during the show, as determined by all juniors. It does not count towards the Junior High Point Award.

Junior High Point and Reserve Award

Junior High Point & Reserve is an award for the junior receiving the most points from classes 1, 2, 12, 13, 26, 28, 31, 33, 42, 44, 52, 53, only, and is calculated as follows: 1st-10 pts, 2nd-8 pts, 3rd-5 pts, 4th-3 pts, 5th-1 pt. Juniors participating in regular classes will not receive extra points. High Point classes divided 6 to 12, 13 to 17. Age divisions may be combined but judged separately. Juniors may not enter Novicio Division Classes. Ties will result in a ride-off.

Championship Classes - 55 - 62, 63, 64

See page 9 for percentages. Open to winners of 1st & 2nd place in all classes qualifying for classes 55 to 64. All Breeding & Luxury Division classes are Peruvian Tack classes, although a pella is not required.

Champion of Champions Classes 65 - 71

Open to current and past Champions from the NPHC Regional Show and PPHRNA, NAPHA, and PHAC National Shows. Past Champions may not compete in qualifying classes for their division if they wish to enter directly, but may enter other division classes. Those entering directly as past Champions and not entered in any other classes at this show must pay an **entry fee of \$65 for members and \$95 for non members**. Those entering directly as past Champions and also entered unlimited in other non-qualifying classes are covered by their unlimited entry fee. **Proof of past Championships should accompany entry form**. All Breeding and Luxury Division classes are Peruvian Tack classes - whites and ponchos or jackets required. NAPHA Rules do not require horses to complete the Prueba in order to enter the Championships, therefore this show will not require one.

RULES FOR CLASSES

Versatility High Point - 19, 20, 21, 27, 30, 32, 34, 40, 43, 46, 49, 50

An entry consists of a horse ridden by the same exhibitor in qualifying classes in order to receive points. **Participants must register at the office and pay \$10 before class 19.** 1st - 5 pts, 2nd - 4 pts, 3rd - 3 pts, 4th - 2 pts, 5th - 1 pt. Winner may ride in closing Barrida. A tie will be resolved with a ride-off.

Tack & Attire

All Breeding/Luxury qualifying and Championship classes are Peruvian Tack Classes, requiring a traditional Peruvian saddle that is clean and functionally sound. Class 49, spurs and the poncho, folded on the saddle, are optional. A jacket may be worn. In all other classes tack other than Peruvian **must** be consistent over the entire horse, with the exception of the bit. All horses in this show **must** use the Peruvian bit or bozal, regardless of tack. **English saddle may not be used with bozal**. Rider's attire to be white shirt and pants, Peruvian hat, scarf and appropriate colour boots and poncho or jacket (in bozal no poncho, spurs or jacket allowed) for Peruvian tack, or clothing appropriate for the tack used (see NAPHA rules.) For ladies, a white split riding skirt may be substituted for white pants. With western tack, lariats and hobbles are not mandatory. Equestrian hard hats are allowed in all classes. No spurs in bare-back, but pads without stirrups are allowed. Tapaderos, (leather stirrups,) are acceptable in all classes.

Performance Division ~ 19, 20, 21, 40, 43, 45, 46, 47,

Horses must be in bit. These classes are open to professionals and amateurs.

Champagne Class, Open - 51

Open, bit. Poncho or jacket optional. Peruvian bit only.

Breeding/Luxury Division ~ 4, 5, 14, 15, 16, 17, 41

Horses must be finished in bit and at least 4 years of age. Open to professionals & amateurs. Ungelded males must be registered as Breeding Stallions. No spayed mare may be shown as a Breeding Mare. All qualifying and Championship classes in this division will be Peruvian Tack classes.

Novicio Division - 6, 8, 18, 39 (see page 12 for new definition)

Participants must use the same animal in all Novicio classes in order to qualify for the High Point Award. Open to all genders, bit or bozal (bozal, 3 - 4 years.) Points are as follows: 1st - 5 pts, 2nd - 4 pts, 3rd - 3 pts, 4th - 2 pts, 5th - 1 pt. Winner may ride in closing Barrida. Ties will result in a ride-off.

Percentages for Breeding/Luxury Division

Bozal - Conformation 45% Condition 5% Brio & Temperament 20% Gait 30%

Bit - Conformation 27% Condition 5% Brio & Temperament 27% Gait 41%

Percentages for Performance Division

Condition 10%, Performance, Brio, Suitability & Manners 50%, Gait 40%.

Stallions

Male horses 4 years of age older must be registered as a stallion or gelding. Registration papers indicating "male" will not be considered acceptable registration papers. The only exceptions will be male horses entered in Colts 3-4 in Bozal. Spayed mares may not be shown as a breeding mare. No Junior under the age of 15 as of January 1st, 2017 may show a stallion in any class. No ungelded males over 12 months may be shown in a class designated for Juniors only. Horses are considered 1 year on January 1st of the year following their birth.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Judges' Authority

The Judges shall have the authority to place a horse in whatever position they believe the merit of the horse justifies. They must, however, award places according to merit starting with 1st and continuing in order. This applies whether there is one entry or many. If there are more horses of merit in a class than prizes, the Judges have the right to award any number of Honorable Mentions. The Judges' decisions as to the placing of horses in a class is final. Under no circumstances will exhibitors be allowed to discuss their standings with the Judges.

Judges' Option

The Judge may ask to ride any horse entered under saddle, in Breeding Division classes, but not in Performance Division. **Exhibitors may elect to not have the Judge ride their horse, but should notify the Ring Steward upon entering the class.** The Judges will not be responsible for any injury which the horse may sustain during this time. Likewise, the owner will not be responsible for any injury which the Judges may suffer resulting from their riding a horse.

Interaction with the Judges

Please join us in extending a warm welcome to our Judge, Chris Austin. We would like to make him feel welcome at our show and encourage everyone to get to know him. We ask, however, that all exhibitors respect the Judge's professionalism and ethics and understand that this is of the utmost importance. We invite appropriate interaction with all show officials, and while it is not our intent to isolate the Judge at social functions, we must insist that any questions regarding particular horses, placings at the show, one's performance or anything pertaining to this show be directed to our Show Steward. There will be a chance to meet with, and question Mr Austin, Thursday evening at 7:00 pm.

Call for Classes

Classes will be announced 3 classes in advance. Three minutes will be allowed after the first horse enters the ring. If a tack or attire change requires a gate hold, the Gate Steward, Bonnie McLoughlin, must be notified in advance. No one may enter the arena after the gate has closed.

Responsibility

All entries are accepted with the understanding that the NPHC, NAPHA, and grounds and arena owners will not be held responsible for any loss, personal damage or injury to horses exhibited, or for any article of any kind or nature that may be lost or destroyed or in any way damaged. All horses shall be under the control and direction of the Show Management but solely at the risk of the exhibitor who will be responsible for any injury that may be occasioned to any person or animal or damage to any property while on the grounds by any horse owned or exhibited by him, and shall indemnify the management against all claims or damages of any kind or nature, including attorney fees and court costs, that may arise out of an injury occasioned by any horse owned or exhibited by him or arising from any cause whatever including the negligence of any other person in charge of any such horse.

Prueba Funcional

NAPHA Rules forbid requiring completion of a Prueba Funcional for entry into Championship classes, therefore this show will not require one.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Cross Entries

Horses are permitted to enter both Breeding and Performance Division classes. Horses may not show in both bit and bozal in the same show.

Artificial Markings

Only clear grooming materials are allowed on the hide or hair except that white powder may be used on white markings. Clear grooming materials may be used on hooves, but black may not. Artificial mane or tail pieces are prohibited.

Health Requirements

Washington State requires horses entering the state to have an official health certificate or Certificate of Veterinary Inspection within 30 days of shipment and a negative Coggins test within twelve months. Exempt are equines under six months of age accompanying a negative dam.

Veterinarian - Dr. Ashley Trtek, DVM 360-794-5409

There will not be a vet on the grounds during the show, but Dr Trtek will be on call. She will be required to call to management's attention any horse which exhibits symptoms of a communicable disease or lameness. If, upon mandatory inspection, the horse is found to be contagious or considered a danger to other animals, it must be removed from the showgrounds or quarantined.

Shoes

NAPHA rules do not allow shoes, however evidence of shoes having been pulled is acceptable.

The NPHC reserves the right to substitute another approved Judge or other official in place of those listed in this premium.

NPHC Annual Meeting

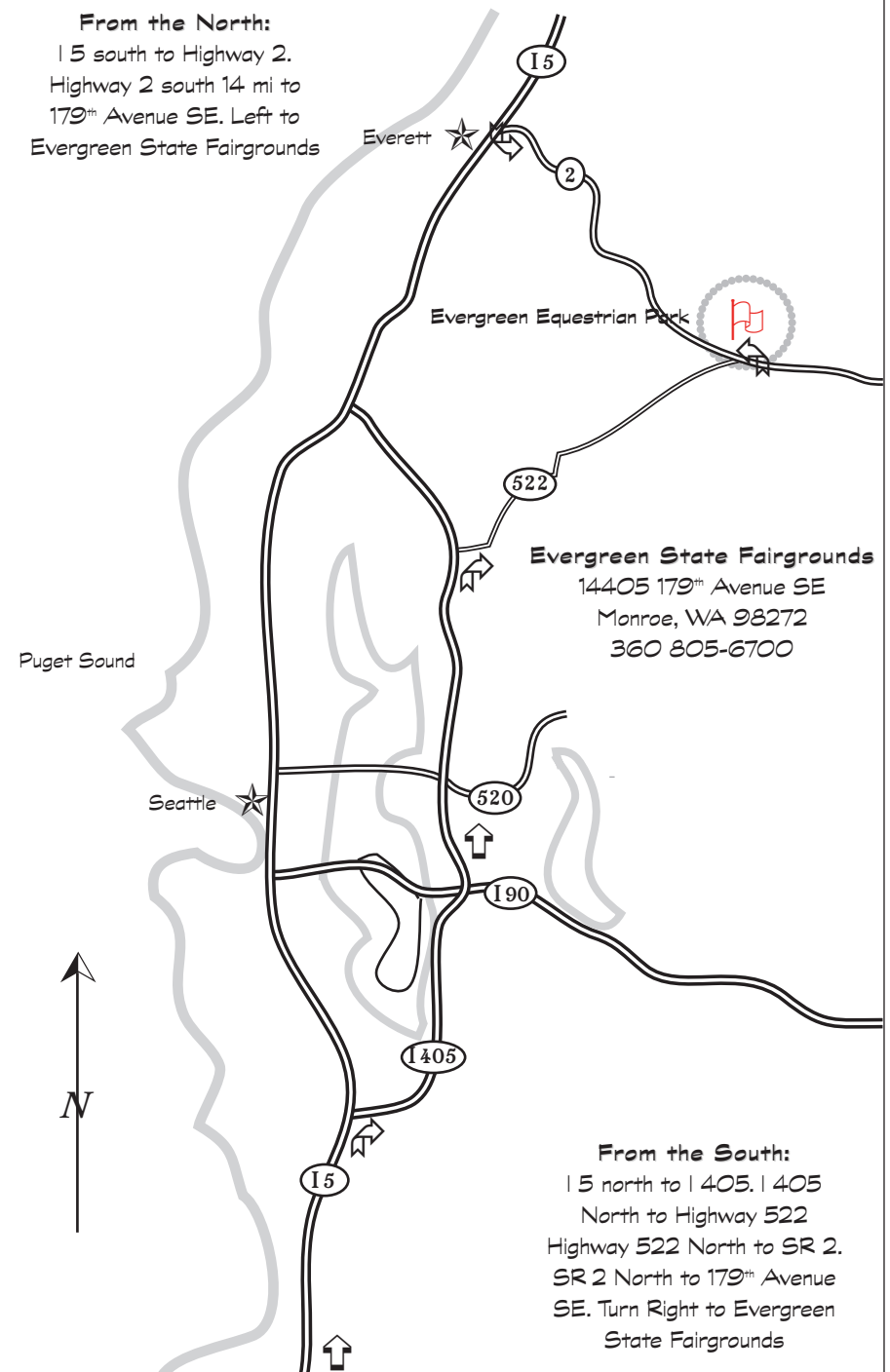

DECLARATION OF AMATEUR STATUS

A person who has not reached his or her 18th birthday is an amateur and need not make an Amateur Status Declaration. A person is an amateur for all competitions conducted under **NAPHA** rules who after his 18th birthday has not engaged in any activities which would make him a professional. A person becomes a professional, for horse show purposes, if he engages in any of the following activities after his 18th birthday:

- (a) Accepts remuneration for riding, driving, showing in halter, training, schooling or conducting clinics or seminars.
- (b) Accepts remuneration for giving instructions in equitation or horse training (persons acting as counselors at summer camps, who are not hired in the exclusive capacity of riding instructors are excluded.)
- (c) Accepts remuneration for employment in other capacity (i.e. secretary, bookkeeper) and rides, drives, shows in halter, trains or schools horses, or gives instructions when his employer or a member of the family of said employer owns, boards or trains said horses.
- (d) Accepts remuneration for the use of his name, photograph, or other form of personal association as a horseman in connection with any advertisement or article to be sold.
- (e) Accepts prize money in equitation or showmanship classes.
- (f) Rides, drives or shows in halter in horse shows, any horse for which he or a member of his family accepts remuneration for boarding or training.
- (g) Gives instruction to any person or rides, drives or shows in halter in horse shows any horse, for which activity another person in his family or corporation which a member of his family controls will receive remuneration.

The following activities shall not affect the amateur status of a person who is otherwise qualified:

- (a) The writing of books or articles pertaining to horses.
- (b) Accepting remuneration for judging or stewarding.
- (c) Accepting reimbursement for expenses without profit.
- (d) Accepting a small token of appreciation, other than money, for riding, driving, or showing in halter. (Note: Horse board, prize money, partial support or objects of more than \$100 are considered remuneration, not small tokens of appreciation.)
- (e) Having the occupation of veterinarian, groom or farrier, or owning a tack shop or breeding or boarding stable in itself, does not affect the amateur status of a person who is otherwise qualified.
