Call for Classes: Classes will be called promptly and with advance notice. Exhibitors shall present themselves to the gate steward in a timely manner to facilitate preparations for the class. After the first horse enters the arena, remaining entries will have 5 minutes to enter prior to closing of the gate. While this is usually sufficient, exhibitors requiring a tack change may request it in advance. Approval of the tack change adds an additional 2 minutes - for a total of 7 minutes after the first horse enters the ring. The

gate will remain open during this time or until all entries have entered the arena. No judging will occur while the gate is open, although the Judge may

Conduct: Each exhibitor while on the show grounds will display his horse in the most natural way possible and maintain his/her horse in a suitable manner. Exhibitors shall at all times take whatever steps are necessary to protect themselves, their horses and the viewing public. The Show Man-



For horse show purposes, the age of an individual on January 1 of the current year shall be maintained throughout the entire show year. Junior classes 12 and younger and 13 and older will run together as a single class, but will be judged separately. Retrancas are not allowed. Floorons are acceptable. Juniors may only ride mares and geldings. Helvets are required for 6-12 and lead line and are encouraged for

All Additions, Scratches, Changes of Rider/Handler,

Tack Changes Must Be submitted to the Show Office On the Official Form Three (3) Classes Prior. An Official

Change/Request is included in your exhibitor's packet.

Shaving/Trimming of the Vibrissae Regarding shaving/trimming of the vibrissae (tactile hairs = "whiskers") on the muzzle and around the eyes of horses. Some European countries have banned this practice to include disqualification for shaved horses. These policies take effect in July of 2021. The USEF is also involved

in the review of these practices in conjunction with the FEI (Federation Equestre International). As we have more of our members/exhibitors who agree with this policy, NAPHA is making a recommendation that exhibitors who choose not to shave the vibrissae will not be penalized for doing so.

For this show: All horses shall be clean, neatly trimmed, in good flesh
